







NATIONAL DIALOGUE CONFERENCE ON ELECTORAL JUSTICE IN KENYA

"Demanding Integrity Accountability and Transparency in the Electoral Processes"

24 June 2021, Villa Rosa Kempinski Hotel, Nairobi

Communique

Preamble:

Guided by the following Constitutional provisions on elections provided in Articles 3, 10, 81 and all other enabling principles, the Elections Observation Group (ELOG) and the Kenya Human Rights Commission (KHRC), in partnership with 15 civil society partners, convened the National Dialogue Conference in Nairobi on Electoral Justice in Kenya on 23 June 2021 to demand integrity, accountability, and transparency in Kenya's electoral processes. The conference brought together 374 participants.²

Inspired and guided by the understanding that for Electoral Justice to prevail in Kenya, we must look at electoral realities, features of Kenya's electoral system and electoral oversight issues as the bedrock for a peaceful, free and fair 2022 General Elections.

Han Ralia Odinga and the ODM party), Han Susan Khika (as a representative of HJ. the Deputy President

In this regard, our enduring ideals for free, open societies and democracies, and our commitment to adhere and comply with the Constitution, we:

- INSIST that elections must be held on 9th August 2022. To this end we demand that IEBC must make the necessary preparations to enable the management and administration of the elections and desist from issuing conflicting signals and excuses on its preparedness;
- 2. DEMAND that IEBC, ORPP, Judiciary, PPDT and other electoral management bodies be adequately resourced to effectively deliver on their mandate. In addition, we call upon IEBC to facilitate an inclusive, timely, voter education, voter registration and verification exercise. The ongoing recruitment of IEBC Commissioners must be concluded urgently through a process that inspires public confidence;
- 3. DEMAND that civil registration bureau move with speed to facilitate the issuance and collection of IDs to all eligible citizens to facilitate voter registration;
- 4. DEMAND that ORPP. Political Parties, IEBC and Office of the Data Commissioner take urgent measures to uphold data privacy of citizens participating in the electoral processes. We will institute PIL against any institution, including corporates that violate citizen's data privacy rights;
- 5. DEMAND that Parliament swiftly enacts the pending electoral related legislations necessary for a credible, peaceful, free and inclusive elections;
- 6. CALL UPON the Judiciary to uphold the constitutional dispensation in their election related jurisprudence;
- 7. DEMAND that the President abides by the rule of law to ensure an enabling environment for the , Judiciary, Constitutional Commissions and independent offices by ensuring appointment relevant commissioners and adequate resourcing;
- 8. URGE citizens to be vigilant and actively engage in every stage of the electoral process; and
- 9. DEMAND that the Inspector General of Police, IEBC and all other relevant agencies to establish and make public an election security plan for the purposes of electoral accountability.
